- Improve PrEP adherence in communities of color
- Address stigma and social inequities

We are thrilled to highlight **Dr. Juh Hyun Shin** as our **August CFAR MACC Nursing Initiative Mentee Spotlight!**

Dr. Shin recently completed a **DC CFAR Pilot Award** and is preparing to disseminate key findings from her project focused on improving the quality of care for older people living with HIV (OPLWH) in nursing homes. Her innovative work involves developing an AI-driven Clinical Decision Support System (CDSS) that integrates standardized nursing languages (NANDA-I, NIC, and NOC), with the goal of equipping nurses with enhanced tools to provide evidence-based care.

Currently, Dr. Shin is preparing a grant application for an AHRQ R01, titled "Developing HIV/AIDS Nursing Care Clinical Decision Support System for People Living with HIV in Nursing Homes Utilizing the Standardized Nursing Languages", which will further her research into transforming geriatric HIV care.

We're proud to support Dr. Shin's contributions to the field and look forward to the continued impact of her work on aging and HIV care nationwide.
